Joe Palmerio: October 16-17, 2021 "Landscapes" (oil/acrylic)

Landscape Painting begins with Composition, followed by Values, then Temperature, Color and Texture, (i.e. brushwork), complete the painting. These are the essential elements that make for a dynamic picture. The workshop will emphasize these basic components. We will explore a variety



of approaches to utilize in composing a picture. We will start with a two color palette for a quick warm up and then proceed to a variety of color coordinated palettes. Website: www.palmerioart.com/

"Painting with Oil and Cold Wax"

This is an introductory workshop acquainting painters with the oil and cold wax method. Day 1: Demo, definitions, and description of techniques, methods, and supplies. Students will practice several techniques and methods using different supplies. Day 2: Demo and further student

MDC Director, Chad Truxall, gave a thorough overview of the history and future of the MDC/AWI partnership and stewardship of the site, to the AWI Board of Directors in September.

• Here are some highlights of his presentation:

We moved onto the site ten years ago in 2011 chosen by the FWC Foundation to lease the property; together we qualified for and fulfilled an ECHO grant to demolish the then existing buildings and restore the current building (Phase I). Chad explained that the mission for the FWC Land Conservation and Deed Restriction is three-fold: research, education and recreation. Over the years MDC and AWI have worked together to better incorporate the Arts component of STEAM and build community involvement.

Under a second ECHO grant, Trails, Amphitheater and Restoration Plantings were accomplished in 2014 (Phase II) In 2019, another ECHO grant allows for reconfiguring the green space including major landscaping and upgrading of the existing Pavilion and building of a new Pavilion Entrance to MDC (Phase III). Chad described Phase IV plans would include a Nature Play Scape and perimeter control of the property to include fencing and berms for safety against vandalism and unauthorized use. Looking out 10-20 years, Chad mentioned that Phase V may include applying for a multi-year ECHO super grant and launching a capital campaign to expand support for the organizations and site management.

Chad explained that 3 years ago, MDC was elevated to the position as lease holder negotiating a lease through May 2058; with this new lease/position comes more responsibilities and more autonomy. Chad noted that AWI's lease is coming up early next year and we are in the process of negotiating a longer-term lease to better align with MDC's lease.

With this background, Chad emphasized the importance of Visioning/Planning for the future development of the site with both organizations in mind. MDC has begun a strategic planning process and Master Site Planning Process and invited AWI to do the same. AWI president Cheryl Faber has begun to convene a Strategic Planning committee.

Title / Medium / Size including frame / Price (paintings must be for sale) / Your name

The last show for this year is our annual small works judged show called "Deck the Walls." Painting or photograph size can be NO LARGER than 8"x 10". (This is a change from last year since I am not concerned about the frame size, just the actual image.) Entries for Deck the Walls should be no more than two years old and not shown in any previously judged show. Also, for a judged show you MAY NOT COPY from a published photograph. This show takes place in December. Judging will take place on Mon. Dec. 6th. Awards will be presented at the Holiday luncheon, Dec. 8th.

Be thinking ahead to next year! Our first gallery show in 2022 for Jan./Feb. is called "Big and Beautiful." I want to give our members who just have to paint BIG an opportunity to show their work. Painting size must be a minimum of 36" in one or more directions, and if framed, no larger than 46". The gallery can accommodate a couple of paintings larger than this. Obviously this will limit the number of paintings that will fit in the gallery. There will be no featured artists for this show, a limit of one painting per artist, and a \$10 entry fee to cover the cost of advertising.

I hope this line up (at right) will give all of our members an opportunity to share their varied talents and subject matter.

During the months of January and February, 2022, our Studio Gallery, 540 Barracuda Blvd., will be presenting a show entitled "Big and Bold Abstracts". This show will run around the same time as the Canal St. Gallery's "Big and Beautiful" show, giving our artists who love to paint large many opportunities to show their work.

As noted in the title, the studio gallery show will be limited to Abstract art and will be co-chaired by Nancy Hagood and Carson Kapp, with Joanne Reilly, chairman of our studio gallery giving assistance. If you are interested in participating in this show, here are the facts you need to know.

- 1. The dates of the studio show will be Sunday, January 23, 2022 for drop off, with pick up being Sunday, February 27th. A "Meet the Artist" opening reception will be on Saturday evening, January 29, 2022.
- 2. Please let us know by Wednesday, November 17, 2021 if you would like to be in the show. Entry will be decided upon by "first come ,first serve", since there will only be room for about 22 large paintings. One side of the artwork has to be a minimum of 36 inches, but no larger than 60 inches. This will not be a judged show, and prizes will not be awarded. The \$10 entry fee (per painting) will be used for extra publicity, to 'hopefully' get more of the community out to see our shows!
- 3. After the first 22 artists have signed up, more details will be sent to those participants. This should be a fun event and a chance to show off your work. Send your commitment to participate to artistsworkshopnsb@gmail.com by NOVEMBER 17, and include the size of your work if known and your email address and best contact number. This is only open to members, but act quickly to reserve your spot!

Lola Marquertte Lawrence



he Artists' Workshop mourns the loss of longtime member Lola Lawrence, who passed away on Saturday, August 28, 2021 from the Corona virus at the age of 87. Our deepest sympathies go out to all her family and friends.

Born in Lewiston, Maine on August 5, 1934, she attended Rivier University in New Hampshire and completed her studies with a Bachelor's Degree in Fine Arts, with Honors,

from the University of Central Florida. Lola was a gifted artist, of painting, sculpting and photography. She is well known throughout the art community in Florida and won many national and state awards for her talent. One of her most beloved and personal family art photos proudly still hangs in the Smithsonian Institute in Washington, D.C. In her early years as an artist, she developed in her own dark room, using black and white photographic techniques which were cutting edge technology of that time. She founded the Southeast Volusia Camera Club in 1993, where she remained active as their President and Director until her recent retirement. She was a longtime member and exhibitor of the "Artist Workshop" in New Smyrna Beach, "The Daytona Art League" and the "Merrimack Valley Camera Club" in Massachusetts.

She is survived by her husband Fred Lawrence and her two children Marcus Thompson and Nila Thompson. She has joined her youngest child Gerry Lawrence, who also passed away from the Corona virus on August 16, 2021.
